The future of Wilson Lacrosse is strong and congratulations to the seniors and underclassmen for the best year in Wilson sports history and all the memories!

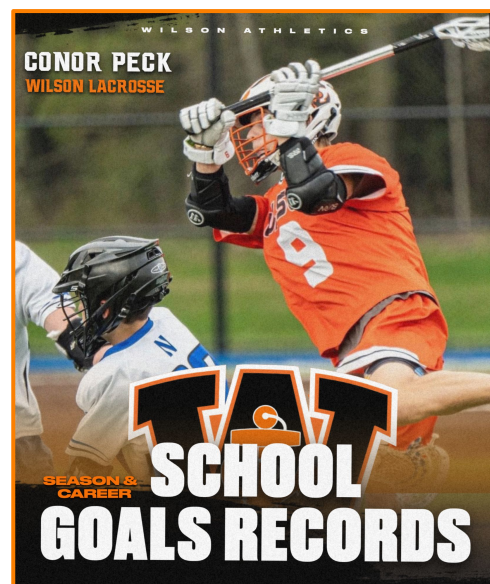


VARSITY LACROSSE

contest was against the undefeated league champs, and was arguably the best game all season. Each member of this team should be proud of their resilience and the dedication they put into the game.

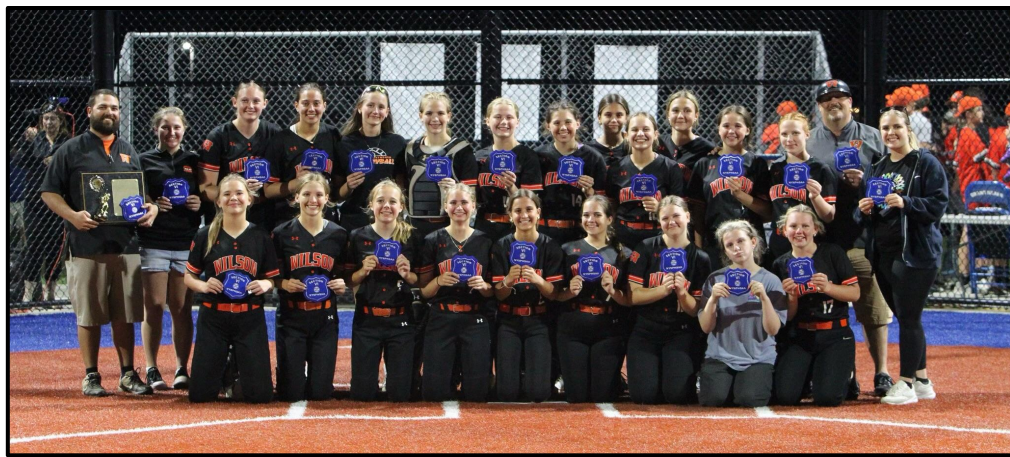
