



## **Parent/Guardian Responsibilities Prior to School Arrival**

### **Signs and Symptoms of Illness**

Prior to entering all Wilson Central School District locations the student(s) parent/guardian must complete a medical screening questionnaire. This questionnaire is accessible through the Wilson CSD website at [wilsoncsd.org](http://wilsoncsd.org) that provides a direct link to the survey using an iPhone or Android phone.

Parents/Guardians should complete this screening prior to arriving at school via the electronic submission form. Although filing of the health survey is preferred to be done online, paper copies of the questionnaire for students will be available at each building front entrance. (Form link)

Parents/guardians will be required to monitor their child(ren)'s temperatures prior to arrival on campus. Anyone whose symptoms response changes from a NO to YES during the day, must see the school building nurse immediately and await further instruction.

Any parent/guardian who refuses to take their child(ren)'s temperature or complete a health screen will not be allowed to enter the building. All students denied entrance must participate via digital means.

Should a person fail the medical screening, specific procedures should be followed. Please reference the Suspect or Confirmed COVID-19 Case section for guidance.



### **Signs and Symptoms of COVID-19**

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness.

Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Close contact with someone who has COVID-19
- Travel within the last 14 days to one of the states that are on the quarantine list

If you have any of the above signs or symptoms you should not come into the school building. You should call your child(ren)'s Primary Care Physician (who will screen you by phone and recommend next steps) or proceed to a facility equipped to test and treat patients with the virus.

If you were exposed to someone who has COVID-19 you should stay home from school for 14 days after exposure.

If you have any of the following symptoms you should go immediately to the emergency room:

- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion or inability to arouse
- Bluish lips or face
